By entering the ride, you consent to the details contained in the entry form being retained by the organisers for up to one year from the date of the ride for the purposes of administering the ride and for communicating with entrants and emergency contacts.

1. PRIZES

Each competitor who has **paid the required sponsorship** amount and completed the course will receive a rosette in recognition of their contribution to the event.

2. THE COURSE

The ride will be approximately ten miles long. It will include various purely optional jumps, all of which can be easily avoided, without penalty, by those preferring to enjoy a ride in some beautiful countryside without jumping. Several of the jumps will have easier and harder alternatives. The two crossings of the River Wye are a particularly popular feature for most riders, but can be avoided if preferred. This is not a competition and it is envisaged that everyone should be able to complete the course at their own pace. Time does not count, but the course is normally completed within two hours.

3. SPONSORSHIP

Minimum sponsorship is £25 for riders 16 years of age and over, and £20 for riders under 16 years of age. Sponsorship money is to be paid on the day before setting out on the ride.

4. ENTRIES

- a) Each rider pays a **non-refundable** entry fee of £20.00, which must be enclosed with the entry form, together with an SAE or a legible email address for starting times and sponsorship forms. Cheques should be made payable to **Berks & Bucks Sponsored Ride.** Card payments / bank transfers may be accepted by prior agreement with the Secretary.
- b) All the entrants on each entry form will be given the same starting time unless otherwise requested.

- d) On receipt of entry forms, competitors will be allocated a starting time and notified of this time. Preferred starting times will be arranged wherever possible but cannot be guaranteed.

5. RULES

- b) All riders must wear hats conforming to PAS 015: 1998 or 2011 with BSI Kitemark, VG1 with BSI Kitemark, ASTM F1163 2004a onwards with SEI mark, SNELL E2001 onwards with official Snell label and number or AS/NZS 3838 2006 onwards.
- c) Horses and ponies must be four years old and upwards.
- d) Dogs must be kept on a lead at all times
- e) Only three attempts are allowed at any jump
- f) Passing is allowed
- g) The B&B Draghounds, The Charities, The Organising Committee, The Land Owners, all persons and all organisations involved in the Ride disclaim all liability for any damage to any person or property, howsoever caused, whether by negligence or otherwise. It is up to participants and spectators to make their own insurance arrangements.
- h) The decision of the Committee on any matter shall be final.
- i) Riders failing to carry out instructions from a steward may be asked to leave the course.
